

61. Boutwell to Milligan

Shew all men by these presents that I James Boutwell for and in consideration of the sum of five Dollars to me in hand paid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged and confessed, by Angus Milligan, do hereby grant bargain sell and deliver unto the said Angus Milligan, the following described property to wit: four head of cattle to wit two cows, and two yearlings all marked with a crop and split in one ear, and crop and unmarked in the other, and branded with J. B. and one yearling colored horse. To have and to hold unto the said Milligan his heirs executors and administrators forever.

This instrument is intended as a mortgage to secure the payment by Boutwell to said Milligan of one hundred and fifty dollars due by open account to said Milligan. When the said Boutwell pays said sum to said Milligan then this instrument to be void else to remain in full force and virtue.
