This indenture made the third day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy four Between Jm. F. Turner of Santa Rosa county and State of Florida of the first part and J. F. Daniels of the same county and State of the second part.

Witnesseth that the said party of the first in consideration of the sum of five hundred dollars lawful money of the United States, to him in hand paid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, hath granted, bargained sold, aliened, remised, released, conveyed and confirmed and by these presents, hath grant bargain, sell alien remise, release, convey and confirmed unto the said party of the second part and to his heirs and assigns forever all that Team and carts one yoke of Oxen in color dun, names, Joe and Logan, one yoke of Oxen in color one yellow and white one black and white, names Bush and Dick one yoke Oxen names Ball & Rudy color Brown with white face, one Red, one yoke of Oxen in color one yellow, one Red, names Bush & Buntz four yoke in all, with two carts one front cart one back cart with chains and rollers, belonging to said team and carts, one row wagon, with iron axle, together with all and singular the tenements, fixed elements and appurtenances, thereto belonging, or in any wise appertaining, and the reversion and remainders, remainder and remainders, rents issues and profits thereof, and also all the estate rights titles interests claim and demand, or whatsoever, as well in law and in equity of the said party of the first part, in and to the same to have and to hold, the above granted and described, team carts & wagons with the appurtenances unto the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns to his and their own proper use and benefit and behoof forever.

It is covenanted, always and these presents are upon this condition that if the said party of the first part, shall well and truly pay his certain promissory note herein even date herewith given to the said party of the second part for the sum of five hundred dollars lawful money as aforesaid according to the tenor of said note, then these presents shall be void and the same cart and wagons hereby granted shall leave and utterly determine.
