Know all men by these presents that we C. S. Simpson Benjamin Overman, B. W. Thompson, James Greary, B. M. Bushnell, Edward H. Roberts, and J. W. Black, partners doing business under the firm name of Simpson & Co. of Blackwater (formerly Bayard) in the county of Santa Rosa and State of Florida for and in consideration of the sum of twenty five Dollars to us in hand paid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted bargained and sold and by these presents do grant bargain sell and convey unto C. S. Raleigh of Blackwater aforesaid his heirs and assigns forever, the following described piece or parcel of land, known as Lot Number four of Block Eleven, as laid down on a Map of the Village of Blackwater, drawn by Lee and Dawson, and on file in the Office of Simpson & Co. being one hundred and thirty four feet front, on the easterly side of Overman Street and running back between parallel lines one hundred and twenty five feet to the centre of Block, to have and to hold unto the C. S. Raleigh his heirs and assigns forever in fee simple together with all the improvements thereon, and notwithstanding upon the following conditions to wit: that neither the C. S. Raleigh his heirs Executors, administrators assigns or assigns shall ever sell, barter, or otherwise dispose of any quantity, any small liquors or other liquors or wines upon or about the aforesaid granted premises
