Whereas on the 1st day of August 1881 the Pensacola and Atlantic
Rail Road Company granted a mortgage to Edmund D.
Randolph as trustee by which it conveyed to said Randolph
its Rail Road from Pensacola to Apalachicola River on the
State of Florida and beyond to a junction with the Jacksonville
Pensacola and Mobile Railroad in said State and upon all
of its other property which has been duly acknowledged
and recorded in the proper Counties in said State was
the payment of three millions of Dollars of mortgage bonds
