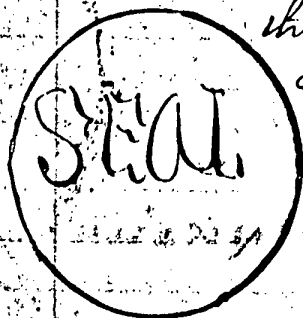


returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General which said Tract has been purchased by the said Joseph Ferrigan. Now know ye that the United States of America in consideration of the premises and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such cases made and provided. Have given and granted and by these presents do give and grant unto the said Joseph Ferrigan and to his heirs the said tract above described to have and to hold the same together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging unto the said Joseph Ferrigan and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof I Millard Fillmore President of the United States of America have caused these letters to be made Patent and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed Given under my hand at the City of Washington the First day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty two and of the independence of the United States the twenty seventh.
