To all to whom these presents shall come; Greeting
Whereas there has been deposited in the general
Land office of the United States a Certificate of the
Register of the Land Office at Gainesville, Florida
whereby it appears that pursuant to the Acts of
Congress approved 20th May 1862 to secure Homesteads
to actual settlers on the Public Domain and the acts
supplemental thereto the claim of Benjamin
Jernigan has been established and duly consummated
in conformity to law for the south west quarter of
the north west quarter and the north west quarter of
the south west quarter of section thirty six in Township
Six north of Range twenty nine west of Tallahassee
meridian in Florida, containing seventy nine
acres and fifty nine hundredths of an acre
according to the official Plat of the Survey of the
said Land returned to the General Land Office by
the Surveyor General. Now know ye that there
is therefore granted by the United States unto
the said Benjamin Jernigan the Tract of Land
above described. To have and to hold the said
Tract of Land with the appurtenances thereof unto
the said Benjamin Jernigan and to his
heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof I Chester A. Arthur President
of the United States of America have caused these letters
to be made Patent and the Seal of the General Land
Office to be hereunto affixed.
