To all to whom these presents shall come Greeting
Whereas there has been deposited in the General
Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the
Register of the Land Office at Gainesville Florida
whereby it appears that pursuant to the Act
of Congress approved 20th May 1862. To secure
Homestead to actual Settlers on the Public Domain
and the acts supplemental thereto the claim of
James Brown has been established and duly
Consummated in conformity to law for the
lot numbered One of section twenty Eight in
township two South of range twenty Eight West
of Tallahassee Meridian in Florida containing
one hundred and forty nine acres and
Eighty hundredths of an acre according
to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said land
returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor
General. Now Know Ye that there is hereby
granted by the United States unto the said James
Brown the tract of land above described
to have and to hold the said tract of land with
the appurtenances thereof unto the said James
Brown and to his heirs and assigns forever
In testimony whereof I Grover Cleveland
President of the United States of America have
caused these letters to be made Patent and the
Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed
Given under my hand at the City of Washington
the twenty second day of November in the year of
our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and
Eighty Eight and of the Independence of the United
States the one hundred and thirtieth
