Whereas there has been deposited
in the General Land Office of
the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land
Office at Gainesville, Florida — whereby it

appears that Pursuant to the Act of Congress approved
20th May, 1862, "To Secure Homesteads to actual Settlers
on the Public Domain, and the acts supplemented
thereto, the claim of Peter E. Diamond has been
established and duly consummated, in conformity to
law for the North East quarter of Section thirty two
in Township Five North of Range twenty nine
West of Tallahassee Meridian in Florida containing
one hundred and sixty two acres and forty eight
hundredths of an Acre — according to the official
Plat of the survey of the said Land, returned to the General
Land Office by the Surveyor General; Now know ye
that there is, therefore, granted by the United States unto the
said Peter E. Diamond, the tract of Land above
described; To Have and to hold the said tract of Land,
with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Peter E. Diamond
and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof, J. Benjamin Harrison,
President of the United States of America, have caused
these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General
Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

the twenty ninth day of April, in the year of our
Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety, and
of the Independence of the United States the one hundred
and fourteenth.
