A meeting of the Citizens of the Village of Corn Hill will
be held at Chummasco in the Village of Chummasco
at One O'clock P.M. February 28th 1891 for the purpose
of forming a Burial association

A meeting of the Citizens (being about 75 persons) was
held at the place and time designated and organized
by electing J. A. McDevil as chairman and H. C. McDevil
as secretary. Whereupon the following proceedings
were had

It was moved, seconded and agreed to
that all those present should form themselves into
a Charitable Burial association the name of
which should be Corn Hill Burial Association.
On motion it was agreed that the meeting should
proceed to elect a President, Vice President, Secretary,
Treasurer and a Board of Managers. That said Board
of Managers to consist of such persons of
whom the President shall be one. Whereupon the
following were elected - President H. C. McDevil
Vice President Ed. McCaskie Secretary H. C. McDevil
Treasurer W. P. McArthur. Board of Managers H. C. McDevil
R. D. Byrnes A. M. McMillan J. A. McDevil W. Williams
G. E. Campbell J. S. Diamond J. Williams Ed. McCaskie.
On motion it was agreed that said persons so elected
should hold their offices for the space of five years
from the time of completing the association.
It was also agreed that the object of the organization
be furthered or raised by donations and hold such land
as necessary for the purpose of a Burial ground only.
