To all to whom these presents shall come; greetings

Whereas there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Gainesville Florida whereby it appears that pursuant to the Act of Congress approved 20th May 1862 "To secure Homesteads to actual Settlers on the Public Domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Henry L. Griffith has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the West half of the North West quarter of Section Twenty Six in Township Three North of Range Twenty four West of Tallahassee Meridian in Florida containing Seventy nine Acres and ninety six Hundredths of an acre, according to the official plat of the Survey of the said land returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General.

Now Know Ye, that there is, therefore, granted by the United States unto the said Henry L. Griffith the tract of Land above described To have and to hold the said tract of Land with the appurtenances thereof unto the said Henry L. Griffith and to his heirs and assigns forever. In testimony whereof I, Benjamin Harrison, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed Given under my hand at the City of Washington the ninth day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred ninety two and of the Independence of the United States the one hundred and sixteenth.
