Homeskaditipiedahingob To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:
 Application 18515
 Whereas there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Gainesville Florida whereby it appears that pursuant to the Act of Congress, approved 20th May 1842 "To secure homestead to actual Settlers on the Public Domain" and the acts Supplemental thereto, the claim of Samuel Dixon has been established and duly enumerated, in conformity with the law, for the South West quarter of Section thirty-six in Township Six North of Range twenty-eight West of Tallahassee Meridian in Florida containing one hundred and sixty-acre and twenty-six hundredths of an acre according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the ^{Said} Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General

Now know ye, that there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said Samuel Dixon the Tract of land above described To have and to hold the said tract of land with the appurtenances thereof unto the said Samuel Dixon and to his heirs and assigns forever;

In testimony whereof I Benjamin Harrison, President of the United States of America, have caused this letter to be made Patent and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed Given under my hand at the City of Washington the fifteenth day of July in the 24th year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one and of the Independence of the United States the one hundred and sixteenth
