Homestead Certificate No 100831
Application 1879 Q Whereas there has been deposited
in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate
of the Register of the Land Office at Gainesville Florida
whereby it appears that pursuant to the Act of Congress
approved 20th May 1862 "to secure Homesteads to actual
settlers on the Public Domain" and the acts supplemental
thereto, the claim of William A. Stewart has been established
and duly consummated in conformity to law, for the
South East quarter of Section four in Township one
North of Range twenty-nine West of Tallahassee Meridian
in Florida containing one hundred and fifty
nine acres and fifty hundredths of an acre
according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said
Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor

Now Know Ye that there is therefore granted by
the United States unto the said William A. Stewart, the
tract of Land above described. To have and to hold
the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof
unto the said William A. Stewart and to his heirs
and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof J. Benjamin Harrison
President of the United States of America, has caused
these letters to be made Patent and the seal of the General
Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
