 To all to whom these presents shall come, I, Grover Cleveland, President of the United States of America, do hereby certify that William W. Allen of Santa Rosa County, Florida, has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Gainesville, Florida, whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said William W. Allen according to the provisions of the act of Congress of the 24<sup>th</sup> of April 1820, entitled "An Act making further provision for the sale of the Public lands" and the acts supplemental thereto for the north East quarter of the South East quarter and the South West quarter of the North East quarter of section seven in Township five North of Range twenty-five West of Tallahassee Meridian in Florida containing seventy-nine acres and being two hundredths of an acre according to the official Plat of the Survey of the land returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said William W. Allen,  
 Now know ye, that the United States of America in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several Acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have given and granted and by these presents do give and grant unto the said William W. Allen, and to his heirs the said tract above described: To have and to hold the same together with all the rights, franchises, immunities and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, then and hereunto belonging unto the said William W. Allen and to his heirs and assigns forever.  
 In testimony whereof, I, Grover Cleveland, President of the United States of America, have caused these presents to be made patent and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed. Given under my hand at the City of Washington, the thirtieth day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight and of the Independence of the United States the one hundred and twenty-first.
