This may or may not be Zephaniah as it has a couple of discrepancies. First, the spelling has the first "A" and the "E" in his name in reverse order of what they should be. This was probably a simple error by the person typing this though – "Zephaniah" is a book in the old testament of the Bible and probably was just a misspelling.

Second, the age is off by about 2 years as he would have been about 33 in 1862. There are some similarities though...on the 1860 census, there's a Zephaniah Brady living in Sugar Tree Bottom, Carroll County, Missouri. Carroll County is where it says this soldier entered into service. Unfortunately, the Zephaniah on the census is 4 years older than ours should be, his wife's name is Mary instead of Louisa, she is 6 years older than she should be, and they have two boys, Francis and Henry ages 10 and 7. In 1860, Zephaniah and Louisa had one son that we know of, William, who would have been about 3. One last thing on this...Louisa's sister Mary and her husband also lived in Sugar Tree Bottom when the 1860 census was taken. My guess is that this *is* actually Zephaniah, but the census taker mistakenly added the information from another family onto his. Did you get all of that?!

Is this William Patrick? If it is, he enrolled in Richmond where the W. P. Brady I mentioned in the "North Carolina to Missouri" section of the book was living. This same regiment and company also has a Soloman, Turney and William A. Hall listed as a soldiers. "Turney" should be "Furney" as I believe this is Furney Hall, Jr. All three were sons of Furney Hall and were William's cousins. There is also a William Price in the same regiment and company who could have been Percy's brother, but I can't be sure as I don't have a birth year for him.
