CURTIS C. BISBE 1838 – 1902

Transcribed by William F. Bisbee

History of Erie County, Pennsylvania, published in 1884 by Warner, Beers & Co., says of Curtis C. Bisbe: "Curtis enlisted August, 1862, in the One Hundred and Eleventh Regiment, Pennsylvania Volunteer Infantry, and was severely wounded in the left leg at the battle of Antietam, Md., September 17, 1862; on account of same was discharged January 19, 1863, and, although he tried to re-enlist, was not accepted on the same account. He was a brave, faithful soldier, and is now an influential citizen, enjoying the respect of the entire community."

Curtis was born at Lebanon, Madison County, New York in 1838, and moved with his parents, Joseph C. and Sally Ann Morey Bisbee, to the State Line Community in Amity Township, Erie County, Pennsylvania in 1857. It is curious that his parents and many of his siblings spelled their name *Bisbee*, while Curtis and at least one of his brothers intentionally and consistently spelled it *Bisbe* with one 'e.'

The following pages are a transcription of some of the more informative and interesting documents in his official pension file at the National Archives.

Adjutant General's Office

Sir:

I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt from your office of application for Pension No. <u>121.460</u>, and to return it herewith, with such information as is furnished by the files of this Office.

It appears from the Rolls on file in this Office, that <u>Curtis C. Bisbe</u> was enrolled on the <u>8</u>th day of <u>Aug.</u>, 1862, at <u>Wattsburgh</u> in Co. "F", 111th Regiment of <u>Penna.</u> Volunteers, to serve <u>3</u> years, or during the war, and mustered into service as a <u>Prvt & Rct.</u> On the <u>2</u>nd day of <u>Sept. 1863</u>, at <u>Harrisburg, Pa.</u>, in Co. "F", 111th Regiment of <u>Penna.</u> Volunteers, to serve <u>3</u> years or during the war. On the Muster out Roll of Co. "F" of that Regiment, for the months of <u>Dated July 19</u>th, 1865, he is reported <u>Private</u> <u>Discharged Jan. 13th, 1863 at Smoketown Hos. Md., of wound rec'd in action.</u>

DECLARATION FOR WIDOW'S PENSION

Act of June 27, 1890, as Amended by Act of May 9, 1900.

D. one thousand nine hundred and <u>two 1902</u> personally appeared before me, a <u>Justice of the Peace</u> within and for the County and State aforesaid, <u>Effie Bisbe</u>, aged <u>36</u> years, a resident of <u>Amity Tp., Erie Co.</u>, County of <u>Erie</u>, State of <u>Penna.</u>, who, being duly sworn according to law, makes the following declaration in order to obtain pension under the provisions of the ACT OF CONGRESS APPROVED JUNE 27, 1890, AS AMENDED BY THE ACT OF MAY 9, 1900.

That she is the widow of <u>Curtis C. Bisbe</u> who was <u>enlisted</u> under the name of <u>Curtis C. Bisbe</u> at <u>Erie, Pa.</u> on the <u>9</u>th day of <u>August</u>, 18<u>62</u>, as a <u>Private</u> in <u>Company F, 111th Regt., Pa. Vol. Inf.</u> and honorably discharged <u>January 13</u>th 18<u>63</u>, having served ninety days or more during the late war of the rebellion. That the soldier was <u>not</u> in the MILITARY OR NAVAL SERVICE of the United States except as stated above. <u>No other service</u> (1 word) under Certificate No 87174 @ 8.00 per month last paid Oct 4th 1902 Claims arrears (1word) date of death Oct 29th, 1902.

That she was married under the name <u>Effie Teed</u> to said soldier at <u>Lowville, Erie Co., Pa.</u>, on the <u>10th</u> day of day of <u>Sept.</u>, 18<u>84</u> by <u>Rev Joseph</u> <u>Allen</u>; that there was no legal barrier to the marriage; that she had <u>not</u> been previously married; that the soldier had <u>not</u> been previously married.

That the said soldier died <u>Oct 29th</u>, <u>1902</u> at <u>home</u>, <u>Amity Tp.</u>, <u>Erie Co.</u>, <u>Pa.</u>; that she was not divorced from him; that she has not remarried since his death; and that she is without other means of support than her daily labor

and an actual net income not exceeding two hundred and fifty dollars per year.

That the said soldier left the following named children who are now living and under sixteen years of age, to wit:

That she has <u>not</u> heretofore applied for pension. <u>This is the first and only</u> <u>application.</u>

That she hereby appoints <u>John L. Wells</u> of <u>Erie, Pa.</u>, her true and lawful attorney, to prosecute this claim and directs that the sum of Ten Dollars be paid for <u>his</u> services.

Pa., for 37 years and 25 years respectively that he died without a will and leaves a farm of two hundred acres valued at three thousand dollars, \$3000, that there are judgments entered against this property amounting to twelve hundred and four and 27/100 (\$1204.29/100) dollars, that the legal debts will use up the personal property, that the farm will not bring an income of more than one hundred and fifty dollars after the debts are paid. The law allows his widow one third of this and we know this to be her only means of support except her daily labor.
