

You are advised that in reply to my request to the Adjutant General, War Department, Washington, D. C., for the military record of Matthew J. Abbott, I have the following report:

> "The name Matthew J. Abbott has not been found on the muster rolls of any organization, Confederate States Army, nor has any record been found of his service, capture or parole as of the 1st Mississippi Cavalry, C. S. A.

One M. J. Abbott who enlisted in Chathem County Georgia, served in Co. I. 7th Georgia Cavalry, C. S. A."

Since this report fails to identify Mr. Abbott as a member of any military organization of the Confederate States Army, C. S. A., from Mikkissippi, and since the testimony of only one witness as to his service has been furnished, it will be necessary before the application of Mr. Abbott can be approved, that he comply with the requirements of the statute.

I am of the opinion that the record given in the second paragraph of this report is not the record of Matthew J. Abbott as it shows that this man enlisted from Chatham County, Ga.

If the military record of Mr. Abbott can be proven as required by the statute, his application will have fur the consideration.


