My dear Senator Sheppard:

I have your letter of June 12, 1926, in which you request to be furnished the record of G. W. Austell, who it is stated enlisted in 1864, and served as a member of Co. B, 5th Arkansas Infantry, C.S.A.

The records show that G. W. Austell enlisted June 19, 1862. at Pineville, as a private of Co. B, 30th Regiment Arkansas Infantry, C. S. A., also known as the 5th Regiment Trans-Mississippi Infantry. His presence or absence is not stated on the muster roll for June 19, 1862. The muster roll for March and April, 1863, next on file, shows him present; for July and August, 1863, next on file, "Absent sick, detailed to go for deserters July 12, 1863, taken on way back," and the roll for January and February, 1864, next and last on file, shows him, "Absent, detailed for deserters July 12, 1863, not since reported. Deserted."

The Union Prisoner of War records show that George Austell, private, Co. B, 5th Regiment Trans-Mississippi Infantry, was captured February 24, 1865, in Phillips County Ark., and was received at Camp Douglas, Ill., from Helena, Ark., March 5, 1865, and at New Orleans, La., from Camp Douglas, May 11, 1865. He was exchanged at New Orleans, La., May 23, 1865. Very respectfully, And Onton


Before me grover n. Curice, County suage, in and for Henderson County, on this day personaly appeared G.W. Austell, who after being by me duly swom says as rollows: My recollection is, that I enlisted Co. b. under Capt biscue in June 1803 xmekaaxxxxxxxxxxxxxx Col. Hart. negiment and den .mcnaes brigade, Army of the Trans-mississippe, Commanded by Gen. Frice, we soldiered though the mortmern part of Arkansas. I was in a pattle of Prairie Grove . From there we went to little nock, where we went into camps. In June we lest hittle nock. and went to helman in Phillipps county and on the 4th day of July we rought a pattle at melena, we took Helena about to o'clock in the morning and the enemy in the aftermoonreceived re-inforcements and took neight from us. on the oth day of July we left Helena and stared back to Little nock. . We had a lot of deserters after the battle of Helena and Capt. Discoe detailed me , my brotherwess Andrews and him self to samer up deservers, we railed in our undertaking and we started to return to Gen. Frice's Command, on the road I was taken very sick, with fever and was sick about two weeks and Capt biscoe told my brother, C.C. Austell, (who is now getting a penson) to stay with me whill I was well , and then to report to his command when I recovered we tried to rejoin capt biscoe's company, but found that we were cut off, and then we went to the nearest confederate Command that we could near of, which was Capt 1.N. Deadrick's troop of Cavarry. He told us that he would notily Capt. pascoe that we were with his command and that he would protect as. We scouted and Shirmised under Capt Deadrick, until February 1000, mear neigh Where I was captured by the rederal soldiers. Later Capt Deaurick was captured at wittsours. I was sent to camp rougias in chicago III, and was exchanged at new orleans at the close of the war

Doar Sirs-

Replying to your favor of July 2, enclosing application of Mr. G.W. Austell for Confederate pension.

This application cannot be approved on account of the records showing Mr. Austell to be charged with desertion in July and August 1863, unless he can establish reinlistment and honorable service after the date of his reported desertion.

If Mr. Austell will make affidavit to the fact that he is "Geo. Austelle, who enlisted in Co. B, 5th Regiment, Trans-Mississippi I"f, and was captured "ebruary 24, 1862 in Phillips County Arkansas" his application will receive further consideration. Let this affidavit detail movements of Mr. Austell from July 12, 1863 until February 24, 1865, giving the date of each movement from camp to another, where he was confined while absent, reasons for not returning to his first command and other detailed information that may have to submit.

The War Department furnished me with a copy of service record of Mr Austell, which I am enclosing. You will note in the record that Mr Austell is reported deserted July 12, 1803. This Mr Austell says is a mistake; that he was detailed to round up deserters and that he was taken sich and was sick a long time; that the first organization that came along when he had recovered his leafth, he joined and told them where he was from and that he continued in this service until captured, and that he never deserted.
