You are advised that there has as yet been no amendments made to the pension law by the Legislature which is now in session in Austin. There is a bill pending before said Legislature which, if finally adopted, will make some change in the date of birth of Confederate widows who will be entitled to pension. If this bill should finally be adopted, I am of the opinion that you would under the proof contained in your application be entitled to pension. If, after the adjournment of the Legislature, you will confer with your County Judge, I am sure he can give you the information you desire with regard to such proposed amendments.

If these changes are made, it will not be necessary for you to file a new application. On request from you, your application now on file will be reconsidered. It is impossible at this time for me to say when this law, if adopted, will become feet-tive.


