I am the widow of Andrew E Boyd, deceased, who departed this life on the 26 day of March, A. D. 1907, in the county of Henderson, in the State of Texas.

I have not remarried since the death of my said husband, and I do solemnly swear that I was never divorced from my said husband, and that I never voluntarily abandoned him during his life, but remained his true, faithful and lawful wife up to the date of his death. I was married to him on the 5th day of July, A. D. 1868, in the county of Henderson, in the State of Texas.

My husband, the said Andrew E Boyd, enlisted and served in the military service of the Confederate States during the war between the States of the United States, and that he did not desert the Confederate Service. I have been a resident of the State of Texas since prior to March 1, A. D. 1880, and have been continuously since a citizen of the State of Texas. I do further state that I do not receive from any source whatever money or other means of support amounting in value to the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars per annum, nor do I own in my own right, nor does anyone hold in trust for my benefit or use, estate or property, either real, personal or mixed, either in fee or for life, of the value of over one thousand dollars; nor do I receive any aid or pension from any other State, or from the United States, or from any other source, and I do further state that the answers given to the following questions are true:

Dear Mr. Boyd:

Replying to your letter of June 22 the records of this office show that Mrs. Sallie E. Boyd, widow of Andrew E Boyd drew a Confederate Pension from the State of Texas under file number 30285 Henderson County.

Mrs. Boyd stated in her application for pension that Andrew E. Boyd served twelve or fifteen months, dates not given, in Capt. McManus's Company, Jamerson's Regiment of Texas Infantry, C. S. A. He joined the company at Athens Texas and served as a scout, also served as a guard at the stockade at Tyler, Texas. Private.

No further information is given as to Mr. Boyd's record as a Confederate Soldier and the application for pension of Mrs. Boyd was approved on the affidavits of witnesses.
