I, Mrs. Ola Buchanan, do hereby make application for a pension pursuant to the provisions of Articles 6204 to 6227, inclusive, of the Revised Civil Statutes of 1925 as amended by H. B. No. 150, passed by the Forty-second Legislature at its Regular Session and all other laws of this State relating thereto.

I am a widow of John Neullin Buchanan deceased, who departed this life on the 25th day of June, A. D. 1938, in the county of Henderson, in the State of Texas

I have not remarried since the death of my said husband; (or in case of remarriage that I am now a widow); and I do solemnly swear that I was never divorced from my said husband.

I have not remarried since my husband's death and that I never voluntarily abandoned him during his life but remained his true, faithful and lawful wife up to the date of his death. I was married to him on the 10th day of July, A. D. 1904, in the county of Navarro, in the State of Texas

My husband, the said John Neullin Buchanan, served as a Confederate soldier (or sailor) in the war between the States of the United States; or (that he was a soldier who under special laws of the State of Texas during said war, served in organizations for the protection of the frontier against Indian raiders or Mexican marauders); or (that he was a soldier of the militia of the State of Texas who was in active service during said war.) That my said husband served

Dear Mrs Buchanan:

I acknowledge receipt of your application for Confederate Pension on the service record of your deceased husband, John N. Buchanan as a Confederate Soldier.

I am very sorry to advise that under the present law of Texas you are not eligible for pension on account of your age. The requirement of the law is that in order for the widow of a Confederate Soldier to be eligible for pension after the death of her husband, she must be a woman born prior to January 1, 1873. You state in your application you were born June 8, 1876 and your age is 62 years. It is for this reason that your application must necessarily be rejected.

Dear Sir:

I acknowledge receipt of your letter of January 16 in which you request information in regard to an application for pension filed by Mrs. Ola Buchanan of Malakoff, Texas, in July, 1938, stating that Mrs. Buchanan had been removed from the Confederate Pension roll of Texas.

You are advised that Mrs. Ola Buchanan has never been a Confederate Pensioner of this State, and her application filed in 1938 was rejected on account of her age. The requirement of the law of Texas is that in order for the widow of a Confederate Soldier to be eligible for pension, she must have been born prior to January 1, 1873. The application of Mrs. Buchanan shows she was born January 8, 1876, and it is on account of the requirement of the law that her application was rejected.

Mr. John N. Buchanan was drawing \$50.00 a month as a pensioner prior to his death because he had a wife with whom he was living and supporting.

I call your attention to Article 6205 Section 2 page 437, General Laws of Texas, 1931 passed by the Regular Session of the Forty-second Legislature, and also to the amendment under House Bill #661 passed by the Forty-fifth Legislature, 1937.

We have for consideration under Public Law 85-425 the widow's pension claim, based on the decedent's Confederate military service. Verification of military service is required before the claim may be approved. The Adjutant General, Washington, D.C., has been unable to assist us in this matter.

Kindly certify the military service of John W. Buchanan, if available from your records. He is alleged to have served in the 35th Texas Cavalry from 1863 to 1865. The important items are the date and place of enlistment, and the date, place, and character of discharge. According to the widow claimant, the deceased was born in 1846, and he enlisted from Rusk, Texas. He died June 25, 1938.
