His name appears on a Return of Troops stationed at Battery Green, Defense of Galveston, Texas, for the month of April 15, 1865, On detached Service at Dallas, Texas, by order from Department Headquarters, in Quartermaster Department since September 17, 1864.

- 1. I am the widow of William Anderson Crawford, who died April, 27, 1928, in a hospital at Shreveport Louisiana, and while a citizen of Shelby County, Texas, where he had resided for the nine years previous to his death and had resided in Texas all of his life, he, being a native of Texas.
- 2. Affiant states that her husband rendered valuable service to the Confederacy and that he did not desert the Army of the Southern Confederacy and further states that he was honorably discharged from said Ermy. Affiant states further that her husband was enlisted in Company H. 2nd Regiment, Texas Cavalry Affiant states that her husband served in said Army from the year 1862 to the month of April 1865, when he was discharged.
- 3. Affiant states further that the number of the Regiment as hereinbefore stated in which her deceased husband served was Company H Second Regiment Texas Cavalry.
