Dear Mr. Evans:

I acknowledge receipt of your letter of February 14 advising me of the change of address of Mrs. D. A. Evans. In the future her Confederate Pension Warrants will be mailed to her at Frankston, Texas.

You are also advised that the State of Texas does not furnish markers for the graves of Confederate Soldiers, but the United States furnishes markers for graves of Confederate Soldiers free of charge and they will ship the stone to the meanest point of the burial grounds.

If you desire to make application for a Confederate Marker, then you should write the Quartermaster General, War Department, Washington, D. C. requesting such blanks.

After you receive the blank forms for making application for a marker you will need the following information to insert in the blank which is in regard to the service of Mr. D. A. Evans:

The records of this office show D. A. Evans drew a Confederate Pension under file number 11945. Deavid Arthur Evans was a private in Company A, also called Company G, 20th Texas Cavalry, C. S. A. He enlisted March 10, 1862 and served until the close of the war in May, 1865.
