Haley, who after being by me duly sworn upon his oath deposes and says that he left the State of Texas about the Ist. day of October, A. D. 1916, on a visit to my son, T. B. Haley, at Idabel, Oklahoma, and that he returned to the State of Texas on the 3rd. day of July, A. D. 1917, that has at no time during his absence from the State of Texas, did he consider any other State his place of residence.

Affiant further states that he was granted a Confederate pension while a resident of Henderson County, but has lost or mislaid his certificate and does not now remember his certificate number.

Wherefore he prays that his certificate be re-instated, and that he be permitted to receive the benefits of the Confederate pension law, as in law and right he is entitled.
