estate or property, either real, personal or mixed, either in fee or for life, of the assessed value of over one thousand
dollars, exclusive of a home of the value of not more than \$1000.00; nor do I receive any aid or pension from any
other State, or from the United States, or from any other source, and that I am not an mate of the Confederate


