The law providing that widows who have remarried and again become widows may become pensioner does not go into effect until June 17, 1919 but it might be well for you to file your application as soon as possible in order that same may be approved on that date. Blank for this purpose is enclosed.

If you are the widow of a man who was in the fromtier service as an Indian fighter you might be able to secure a Federal pension and I would advise that you write the Adjutant General of this State or your Congressman in Washington City relative to same.

You are doubtless entitled to a pension from some source and I shall endeavor to assist you in every way possible to secure same.
