Your petitioner, J. D. Jordan respectfully represents that he is a resident citizen of Henderson County, in the State of Texas, and that he makes this application for the purpose of obtaining a pension under the act passed by the Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Texas, and approved May 12, A. D. 1899, the same being an act entitled "An act to carry into effect the amendment to the Constitution of the State of Texas, providing that aid may be granted to disabled and dependent Confederate soldiers, sailors, and their widows under certain conditions, and to make an appropriation therefor," and I do solemnly swear that the answers I have given to the following questions are true.

- Q. What real and personal property do you now own, and what is the present value of such property? Give list of such property and value. Answer One mule, value \$60.00

The application for pension of J. D. Jordan states he was a private in Clanton's Battery. The affidavits of witnesses claim J. D. Jordan was a private in Clanton's Battery of Alabama. He enlisted in 1861 and served until the close of the war in 1865. No further information is given as to his service.

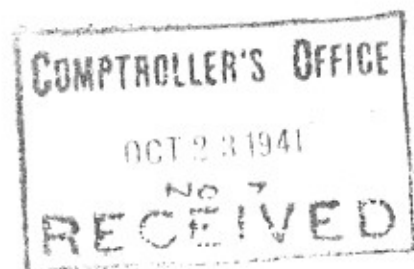
