The name M. D. Lemmons has not been found on the rolls, on file in this office, which partially cover period from July to October, 1863, of Company D, 57th Alabama Infantry, C. S. A., and no record has been found of the service, capture or parole of a man of this name and organization.

The Union records of prisoners of war show that one Murdock Lammons, private, Company F, 27th Alabama Infantry (of which the 57th Alabama Infantry formed a part after April 9, 1865), C. S. A., was paroled at Greensboro, N. C., May 1, 1865. No further record found.
