other State, or from the United States, or from any other source, and that I am not an inmate of the Confederate

The name G. C. Meredith has not been found on the rolls, on file in this office, of any company of the 13th Regiment Texas Volunteers (also known as Bates Regiment Texas Volunteers), Confederate States Army, and no record has been found of the capture or parole of a man of this name and organization.

On return of the above-named regiment for June, 1864, one J. C. Meredith, private, was reported to have enlisted May 10, 1864, at Athens. No later record of him has been found.

On return of the same regiment for July, 1864, one E. Merideth was reported to have joined July 22, 1864, at Velasco. No later record of him has been found.

On return of the same regiment for September, 1864, one C. C. Meredith is was reported to have deserted. September 29, 1864. No later record of him has been found of the same regiment for April, 1865, one G. C. Meredith, private, Company B, was reported to have come in under General Lee's amnesty proclamation, and to have been gained from desertion April 2, 1865. No later record of him has been found.

The application for pension of Mr. Meredith was approved on reports from Washington, D. C., and also affidavits of witnesses.
