I, Mrs. Emma M Morrison, do hereby make application to the Commissioner of Pensions for a pension, to be granted me under the Act passed by the Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Texas, and approved April 7, A. D. 1913, on the following grounds:

I am the widow of Henry M Morrison, deceased, who departed this life on the 30 day of January, A. D. 1899, in the county of Henderson, in the State of Texas

I have not remarried since the death of my said husband, and I do solemnly swear that I was never divorced from my said husband, and that I never voluntarily abandoned him during his life, but remained his true, faithful and lawful wife up to the date of his death. I was married to him on the 7 day of Oct, A. D. 1880, in the county of Henderson, in the State of Texas

My husband, the said Henry M Morrison, enlisted and served in the military service of the Confederate States during the war between the States of the United States, and that he did not desert the Confederate Service. I have been a resident of the State of Texas since prior to January 1, A. D. 1900, and have been continuously since a citizen of the State of Texas. I do further state that I do not receive from any source whatever money or other means of support amounting in value to the sum of \$300.00 per annum, nor do I own in my own right, nor does anyone hold in trust for my benefit or use, estate or property, either real, personal or mixed, either in fee or for life, of the value of one thousand dollars, exclusive of the home of the value of not over \$1,000.00; nor do I receive any aid or pension from any other State, or from the United States, or from any other source, and I do further state that the answers given to the following questions are true:

1. What is your age? 58 years
2. Where were you born? In Henderson Co, Texas
3. How long have you resided in the State of Texas? 58 years
4. How long have you resided in the county of your present residence? And what is your postoffice address? 40 years
5. Did husband draw a pension? If so, give his file number. He did not draw a pension
6. What was your husband's full name? Henry M. Gray Morrison
7. What was the date of his death? Jan 30 - 1899
8. In what State was your husband's command originally organized? In Texas
9. How long did your husband serve? If known to you give date of enlistment and discharge. About 4 years - I do not know date of enlistment or discharge
10. What was the name or letter of the company, or number of the battalion, regiment or battery of artillery in which your husband served? If he was transferred from one branch of service to another, give time of transfer, description of command and time of service. Co. H, 6th Texas Regiment -

11. Name branch of service in which your husband served, whether infantry, cavalry, artillery or the navy, or if commissioned as an officer by the President, his rank and line of duty, or if detailed for special service, under the law of conscription, the nature of such service, and time of service.

Cavalry - He was commissioned as Capt of Co. H - He was a volunteer and was not detailed for any special service

12. Have you transferred to others any property of any kind for the purpose of becoming a beneficiary under this law? No

Wherefore your petitioner prays that her application for a pension may be approved and such other proceedings be had in the premises as are required by law.

The records show that one Henry M. (also borne as H.M.) Morrison served as a private, as 1st lieutenant and finally as captain, of Company I (not found as of Company K), 6th Reg't Texas Cavalry, C.S.A.; that he enlisted September 21, 1861, at McKinney, Texas; was captured at Hatchie Bridge October 5, 1862, and was exchanged near Vicksburg, Miss., November 2, 1862. On the muster roll for May and June, 1864, last on file, he was reported present. The records further show that, as captain of the organization mentioned, he resigned February 11, 1865, on account of being a supernumerary, his company having been consolidated with another company. No later record of him has been found.

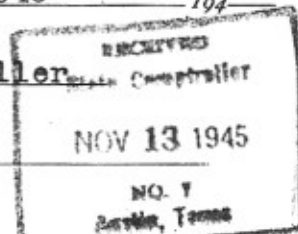
