The State of Texas: Before me, the undersigned authority, on this day County of Henderson: personally appeared C. M. Sindes and J. T. Paschol, who being by me duly sworn, depose and say:

That our age is 65 and 82 years respectively and our present place of residence and Post Office address is Henderson County, Athens, Texas.

We personally knew Hampton Phillips and have known him since 1860. First knew him at Athens, Henderson County, Texas. We personally knew that he enlisted in the service of the Confederacy and performed the duties of a soldier. He enlisted in Co. F, 15th. Texas Infantry in 1862 at Athens, Texas, and served till the close of the war.

Our source of knowledge of his service is having served in same Co. and Regiment with him.

We knew of no other soldier serving in said Company by the name of Hampton Phillips, and we are posatively certain that applicant herein is the identical person serving as testified.

We know that Hampton Phillips never deserted the Confederaty.

We further know that Hampton Phillips is unable to support himself by labor of any sort.

This knowledge is not based upon conjecture.
