J. Pierce then joined the 15th. Tennessee Cavalry, Got. Dawson— Col. Buchannan, Capt. We both remained in the same cavalry service until the end of the war and surrendered with N. B. Forrest at Gainsville, Ala.

The said Latta states that he lead the sedond Company from Dyer County, knows and states that the said A. J. Pierce throughout did serve throughout the war as stated by the witness Tarrant.
