The Union prisoner of war records show that the soldier was captured at Donelson February 16, 1862, and sent to Vicksburg September 2, 1862, to be exchanged. His name appears as signature to an oath of allegiance dated at Nashville, Term., Jan.9, 1865, on which is inscribed the following indorsement: "Oaths of alleg. of Reb. deserters taken at Nashville, Tenn."

No later record found, nor anything additional relative to the inquiry.
