The prisoners of war records (Union) show John _ Simmons, private, Company <u>I</u>, lst Alabama Cavalry, Confederate States Army, captured July 29, 1863, died of smallpox August 27, 1863, at Alton prison.

The records show that Company H, lst Alabama Cavalry, became Company A, 12th Alabama Cavalry, Confederate States Army. The records of the latter organization show John K. Simmons, corporal, Company F, 12th Alabama Cavalry, enrolled September 9, 1862. On muster roll dated December 31, 1864, last on file, he is reported present. Nothing further relative to him has been found of record.
