Agreeable to my letter of June 9th, you are advised that I am now in receipt of a report from the Wer Department, Washington, D. C., in reply to my request forthhe military record of C. E. Waldrom as a Confederate soldier, which report follows:

A., nor has record been found of his service, capture or parole as of any organization of Infantry. State of Miss.. C. S. Army degisnated Co. B. 2nd. Regiment. nor as of the 13th Miss. Inf., C. S. A.

The records show that one C. Waldrom, Co. B. 2nd, State Troops, Miss. Inf. (30 days, 1864) C. S. A., cnlisted Aug. 23, 1864, at Wayne, for 30tdays. Muster roll August 23 to Septp 17, 1864. (only roll on file.) shows him present, a Private. Capture, parole or later record not found.

One James E. Waldrom, who enlisted at Corinth, Miss., served in Co. B. 13th Miss, Inf., C. S. A."

Since this report identifies Mr. Waldrom as a member of Company B. 2nd State Troops of Mississippi. Infantry. he would not be entitled to pension under this service being a member of the Reserve or State Troops of Mississippi.

I note from the application, Mr. Waldrom claimes to
