Wallace respectfully represents that he is a resident citizen of Henderson county, in the State of Texas, and that he makes this application for the purpose of obtaining a pension under the act passed by the Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Texas, and approved May 12, A. D. 1899, the same being an act entitled "An Act to carry into effect the amendment to the Constitution of the State of Texas, providing that aid may be granted to disabled and dependent Confederate soldiers, sailors and their widows under certain conditions, and to make an appropriation therefor," and I do solemnly swear that the answers I have given to the following questions are true.

NOTE—Applicant must make answer to all of the following questions, and such answers must be written out plainly in ink.

- Q. What is your name? Answer W. A. Wallace
- Q. What is your age? Answer I will be 80 years old 23rd of March, 1909.
- Q. In what county do you reside? Answer In Henderson County Texas
- Q. How long have you resided in said county and what is your postoffice address? Answer About 8 months. I moved from Van Landt Co. to this County - (My Post Office is Athens Texas)
- Q. Have you applied for a pension under the Confederate Pension Law heretofore, and been rejected? If so, state when and where? Answer No, I never applied for a pension before
- Q. What is your occupation, if able to engage in one? Answer Farming
- Q. What is your physical condition? Answer I am crippled up with Rheumatism and Old age
- Q. If your physical condition is such that you are unable by your own labor to earn a support, state what caused such disability? Answer Exposure in the Civil War and Old age
- Q. In what State was your command originally organized? Answer Alabama
- Q. How long did you serve? Give date of enlistment and discharge. Answer I liked a few months of serving 4 years - Enlisted - day of May 1861 - Discharged a few weeks after Lee's Surrender.
- Q. What was the name or letter of your company and name or number of your regiment? Answer Company D. Regiment 36 Alabama Infantry.
- Q. State whether you served in the infantry, artillery, cavalry, or the navy. Answer Infantry
- Q. State whether or not you have received any pension or veteran donation land certificate under any previous law, and if you answer in the affirmative state what pension or veteran donation land certificate you have received. Answer I have never received any pension whatever, nor Veteran Donation Land Certificate of any kind TX
- Q. What real and personal property do you now own, and what is the present value of such property? Give list of such property and value. Answer I own no land of any kind, I have one little pony, one old buggy and harness - I paid \$30.00 for the old pony, buggy and harness, the outfit is now worth about \$20.00, the pony is now crippled and is not worth so much.

Q. What property, and what was the value thereof, have you sold or conveyed within two years prior to the date of this application? Answer *I have sold no property other than my little crops*

Q. What estate has your wife in her own right, real and personal, and what is its value? Answer *She has no estate whatever*

Q. What income, if any, do you receive? Answer *I have no income whatever*

Q. Are you in indigent circumstances; that is, are you in actual want, and destitute of property and means of subsistence? Answer *I have no means of support and am in destitute circumstances*

Q. Are you unable by your labor to earn a support? Answer *I am*

Q. Have you transferred to others any property of value of any kind for the purpose of becoming a beneficiary under this law? Answer *No I have not*

Q. Did you ever desert the Confederacy? Answer *No I did not*

Q. Have you been continuously since the first day of January, 1880, a bona fide resident citizen of this State? Answer *Yes, I came to Texas in the year 1868.*

Q. If you originally enlisted in the Confederate service from the State of Texas, were you at the date of the passage of this act a bona fide resident citizen of the State of Texas? Answer *I did not enlist in Texas*

Wherefore your petitioner prays that his application for pension be approved and that such other proceedings be had in the premises as are required by law.

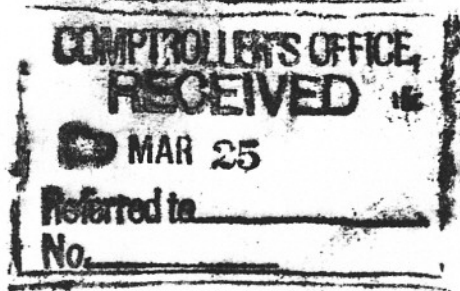
